**10 Years Ago**  
The class of 1936 scholarship winners at St. Mary's Academy were Mary Kathryn Coyne, Lucille Hickey, Laureen Baumeister, and Cecelia Edwards. Mrs. William Nollkamper died in Omaha at the age of 81. Mr. and Mrs. Nollkamper were pioneers in this region, living on the Eagle 20 miles north of here, later moving to the Rosebud territory when it was opened. Work of removing the Episcopal church from the lots purchased by the government for a new postoffice building was commenced last week.

**Dwight Griswold, of Gordon**, Republican candidate for governor, delivered the Memorial day address at Atkinson. . . . Julius D. Cronin is a delegate from the Third Congressional district to the national convention to be held in Cleveland. . . . Total rainfall so far this year exceeds nine inches.

**25 Years Ago**  
Rolla and Della Dehart, arrested at Burwell last week as suspects in the murder of John Mize, of Platte, S. D., whose body was found floating in the Niobrara river near the Parscarr bridge, are in separate cells here, and are allegedly confessed murderers. Mrs. Anna May Schollmayer, 83, died here Sunday after an illness of six months. She and her husband were pioneers in the Scottville community, settling there 39 years ago when the country was a raw prairie. . . . John Stevenson, a pioneer in north Nebraska, died at Ainsworth June 1. . . . J. A. Dowling departed from Pueblo, Colo., for his home here last week, leaving there just an hour before a flood hit Pueblo. The flood, which followed a cloudburst, caused a great loss of life and property. Two dams were broken. . . . The city council has purchased a new water tower, and work of tearing down the old one has already begun.

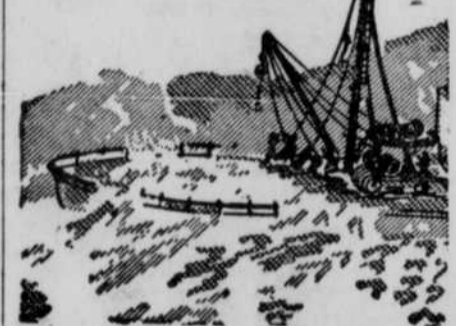
