Painting the Prairie

The breeze is perfumed with the fragrance of sweetclover bloom; the steady roar of a tractor comes from a ripened grain field as it makes the rounds, harvesting the crop; dun-gray spots gleam in the sunlight on the distant bluff, where wind and countless hoofs have worn-away the sod; yellow flowers and meadow daisies give their splash of color to the summer green; butterflies with wings that were dipped in the nameless shades of the cocoon's mysterious laboratory; bees sipping nectar from cups of pearl on white clover bloom; clusters of silver-grey clouds lying against the eternal blue of the heavens; the shimmering silk of

fluttering leaves in high tree-tops; it's mid-afternoon in quiet prairie-land.

The Amelia postoffice serves three routes—a far cry from the beginning of mail service at that point, when the bag of mail was carried on the back of a sturdy pioneer, who walked the 38 miles to O'Neill with it.
