Holt County Board of Supervisors met as per adjournment. All members present. Meeting called to order by the Chairman. A motion was made by Stein, seconded by Collins that a Resolution be sent to the State Department of Roads & Irrigation requesting their aid in constructing the unfinished portion of the Stuart-Naper Road. Motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Holt County is the owner of the South Eighty-three and one-third (83 1-3) feet of Lots Thirteen (13), Fourteen (14), Fifteen (15), and Sixteen (16), in Block Ten (10), of O'Neill, Holt County, Nebraska; and
