## A Visit to the 'Big Muddy'

The writer accompanied Messrs. Gillespie, McManus and Nolan on a recent visit to the charming grounds of Niobrara state park, lying in shaded tranquility between the Missouri and Niobrara rivers near the town from which the park derives the name.

Niobrara, once the gateway to north Nebraska, when settlers crossed the Missouri at Running Water, Dakota Territory where homesteaders went to wader \$14 with the U. S. land office that they could hold down a quarter section of virgin prairie; where such notables as Ed Fry, Lamont, A. B. Charde and Col. Towle had cast anchor, is now a well-appointed town compared to the wild west aspect when first I saw it in the early '80s.

We went to the ferry landing two miles from town. The muddy Missouri rolls on to the Mississippi as it has since the ancestors of Sitting Bull paddled their canoes from shore-to-shore and fur traders worked

their way to the headwaters. Wind blew off of the dreary bluffs on the Dakota side, sand rolled in clouds on the farther shore, the troubled waters were grey and forbidding as we awaited the oncoming ferry boat from Running Water as it made its slow and even way against the current. Five automobiles, with the passengers, rolled onto Nebraska soil when the ferry cast anchor.

At the park, Senator Butler and Congressman Stefan greeted us cordially. Mr. Stefan has to do with the federal undertaking at Ft. Randall.

The over-all picture in Antelope, Knox, Boyd and Holt counties is good. A few spots were hailed out and some damaged by drought. Evidence of poor farming as the car moved over the highway inspired the Irish wit of our party to remark: "A d--- Irishman lives there."

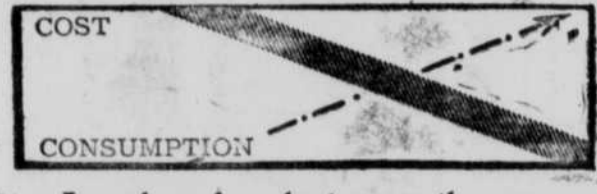
