PROCLAMATION OF GENERAL ELECTION

Notice is hereby given that a General Election will be held in the several voting precincts of the County of Holt, State of Nebraska, on Tuesday, the fifth day of November, 1946, during the hours designated by law, for the following purposes, to-wit:

1. For the Election of one United States Senator.
2. For the election of one member of Congress from the Fourth Congressional District of the State.
3. For the election of the following officers to-wit:

- One Governor
- One Lieutenant Governor
- One Secretary of State
- One Auditor of Public Accounts
- One State Treasurer
- One Attorney General
- One Railway Commissioner
- One Superintendent of Public Instruction

4. For the election of an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court for Supreme Court District Number six.

5. For the election of one member of the Unicameral Legislature for the twenty-eighth Legislative District of the State.

6. For the election of a Director of the North Central Nebraska Rural Public Power District

7. To vote upon an amendment to Section 6, Article VII of the Constitution of Nebraska, relating to free instruction in the common schools so as to require that the Legislature shall raise revenue for the schools from sources other than real property tax, in a sum of not less than forty dollars (\$40.00) per pupil in average daily attendance and to provide for the distribution thereof among the school districts of the State.

8. To vote upon an amendment to the Constitution of Nebraska relating to and prohibiting denial of employment to any person because of membership or nonmembership in or resignation or expulsion from a labor organization; prohibiting any contract to exclude persons from employment because of membership or non-membership in a labor organization; defining "labor organization" as any organization of any kind, or any agency or employee representation committee or plan, which exists for the purpose, in whole or in part, of dealing with employers concerning grievances, labor disputes, wages, rates of pay, hours of employment or conditions of work; providing that said amendment be self-executing.

9. For the election of the following County Officers, to-wit:

- One County Clerk
- One County Treasurer
- One Clerk of the District Court
- One County Attorney
- One Register of Deeds
- One Sheriff
- One Assessor
- One Surveyor
- One Supervisor from each of the First, Third, Fifth and Seventh Supervisors Districts of the County.
- One County Superintendent of Public Instruction

10. For the election of the following Precinct officers, to-wit:
- One Township Clerk
 - One Township Treasurer
 - One Justice of the Peace
 - One Precinct Assessor
- At which election, the polls will open at 8:00 o'clock a. m., and remain open until 8:00 o'clock p. m., of the same day.

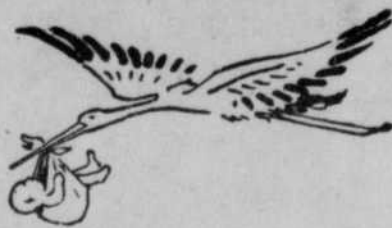
