Measures Proposed by Initiative Petition

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION

300 [] YES AN AMENDMENT to Section 6, Article VII, of the Constitution of Nebraska, relating to free instruction in the common schools, so as to require that the legislature shall raise revenue for the schools from sources other than real property tax in a sum of not less than forty dollars (\$40.00) per pupil in average daily attendance and to provide for the distribution thereof among the school districts of the State.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION

302 [] YES AN AMENDMENT to Constitution of Nebraska relating to and prohibiting denial of employment to any person because of membership or nonmembership in or resignation or expulsion from a labor organization; prohibiting any contract to exclude persons from employment because of membership or nonmembership in a labor organization; defining "labor organization" as any organization of any kind, or any agency or employee, representation committee or plan, which exists for the purpose, in whole or in part, of dealing with employers concerning grievances, labor disputes, wages, rates of pay, hours of employment, or conditions of work; providing that said amendment be self-executing.
