SEEDED TEAMS WIN OPENERS

Orchard, Inman Sink Ewing, Clearwater in Tourney Here

PAGE SPILLS OSMOND

Orchard and Inman, the seeded teams in the annual Elkhorn Valley conference basketball tourney breezed through the opening round Wednesday night with decisive wins.

Orchard dumped Ewing 38-22 after a 22-11 halftime advantage. Forward Young and Schleusner showed the way with 16 and 14 points, respectively. The loser's best was Forward Bergstrom with seven.

The undefeated Inman quint was pressed during the first half but pulled away later to down Clearwater 32-79. Forward Mossman's 13 points were high for Inman.

Page piled up a 14-point half lead over Osmond and won 33-21. Osmond's second-half spurt came within five points at one stage of the game but the lead was too great. Page's Forward D. Heiss chalked up 18 tallies — the evening's high.

In semi-final play Thursday night, Orchard faces Brunswick, which had drawn a first-round bye, and Inman meets Page. Finals are Friday night. Page is the defending champion.

Inman, Orchard Win in Semifinals

Inman and Orchard drove to the finals in the annual Elkhorn Valley conference cage tourney Thursday night, Inman winning a hairbreadth overtime thriller from Page and Orchard dumping Brunswick handily.

The unbeaten Inman Tigers trailed Page 3 to 6 at the halfway mark, both clubs playing tight, conservative ball. The count at the end of the regular playing time was 20-all. In the last 35 seconds of the extra period, Guard Paul Hartigan sank a free toss that eliminated Page, the defending champions. Center Mossman led Inman's scoring with 13 points while Forward Darrel Heiss of Page collected 11.

The tilt was easily the best game thus far in the tournament. Orchard coasted through Brunswick and scored virtually at will. The Orchard front line—Young and the Schleusner brothers—accounted for 45 points.

In consolation play Osmond nipped Clearwater 20 to 19 after Clearwater led 13 to 10 at intermission.

The Inman-Orchard title match is set for 8:45 p.m. Friday night.
