Holt county basketball enthusiasts will be treated to an honestto-goodness first-class brand of amateur basketball next Thursday night under the sponsorship of the Lions club here.

The Pierce Cardinals and Wayne Morrisons will square-off on the public school maples in a continuation of a friendly fued that began earlier in the season in the Wayne amateur tourney.

The Cards are an unsponsored team, recruited largely from ex-Pierce high school stars and excollege stars who hail from the Pierce neighborhood, which has traditionally been a seat of good basketball. Unsponsored, the Cards have won 14 games and lost two in amateur competition, including wins over Norfolk junior college, Midland college, Norfolk Legion, Humphrey Independents, Vermillion (S. D.) Independents, Sioux Travelers, Texas Brown Bombers, and Wayne Quality Market.




