Nebraska will celebrate its 80th year of statehood on March 1, and Gov. Val Peterson has proclaimed that day as "Nebraska state day."

In urging all civic, patriotic organizations, and schools to provide suitable observances on March 1, the governor stated, "During those 80 years Nebraska has established herself as an important agricultural state and is presently expanding her industrial activities."

"Now that we have hurdled the period of reconversion we must again focus our attention on the task of laying a solid foundation upon which to improve and expand our schools, state institutions, agricultural development and our industry."

No special observances have been planned for Holt county, as far as The Frontier has been able to learn, but 1,800-mile away—in Lone Beach, Calif.—the winter Nebraska state picnic will be held in Rivby park. Numerous former Holt countyans are expected to be present, and a number of the oldtimers will be seated on the platform.

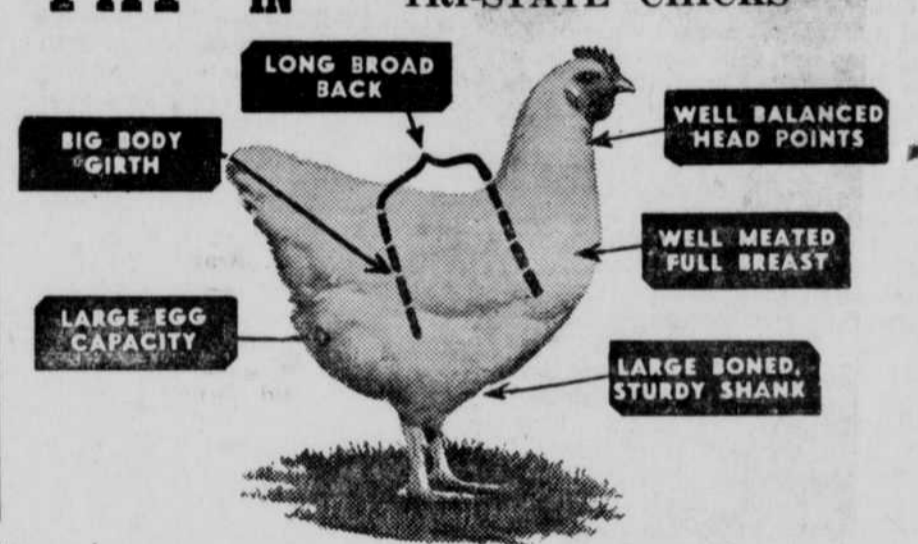
