Where do settlers find their first year's supply of seeds and the necessary farming implements? How near does any railroad or other facility come to the grants you now have? Are the grants well supplied with fresh water, spring or brook?"

Signed, (Editor's note: Author's name was not published.) "P. S. Please give the highest and lowest temperature in those regions where in are situated the grants."
