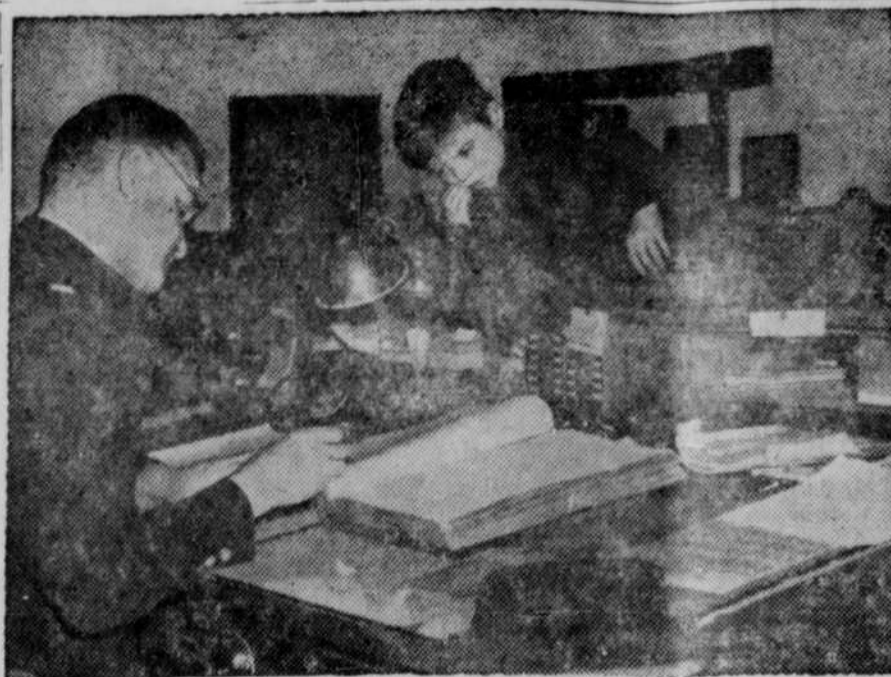
EMMET—Kathleen Grothe celebrated her 6th birthday anniversary Friday at the school-house. Games were played after
