TO VALUE YOUR TRUCK (1935 to 1947 MODELS), AND YOUR CAR (1940 to 1947 MODELS) PROPERLY, SOME ADDITIONAL INFORMATION MUST BE FURNISHED BY YOU. IN THE CASE OF YOUR TRUCK, EITHER A STRAIGHT JOB OR A SEMI, LET US KNOW THE WHEEL BASE OF THE TRUCK AND THE KIND, AGE, AND TYPE OF BODY (PLATFORM, STOCK RACK, STAKE, GRAIN, DUMP, TANK, REFRIG., OR VAN) ON YOUR TRUCK. DO NOT OVERLOOK THIS NOTICE BUT SEND IN A COMPLETE DESCRIPTION OF YOUR TRUCK (1935 to 1947 MODELS) AND YOUR CAR (1940 to 1947 MODELS) GIVING US THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE TITLE, ALSO THE INFORMATION ABOVE REFERRED TO. SO WE MAY BE ABLE TO PLACE THE PROPER VALUE ON YOUR TRUCK AND CAR FOR ASSESSMENT IN 1947.

IF WE DON'T HAVE THIS INFORMATION YOUR CAR OR TRUCK MAY BE GIVEN A HIGHER VALUATION THAN IT SHOULD BE GIVEN.
