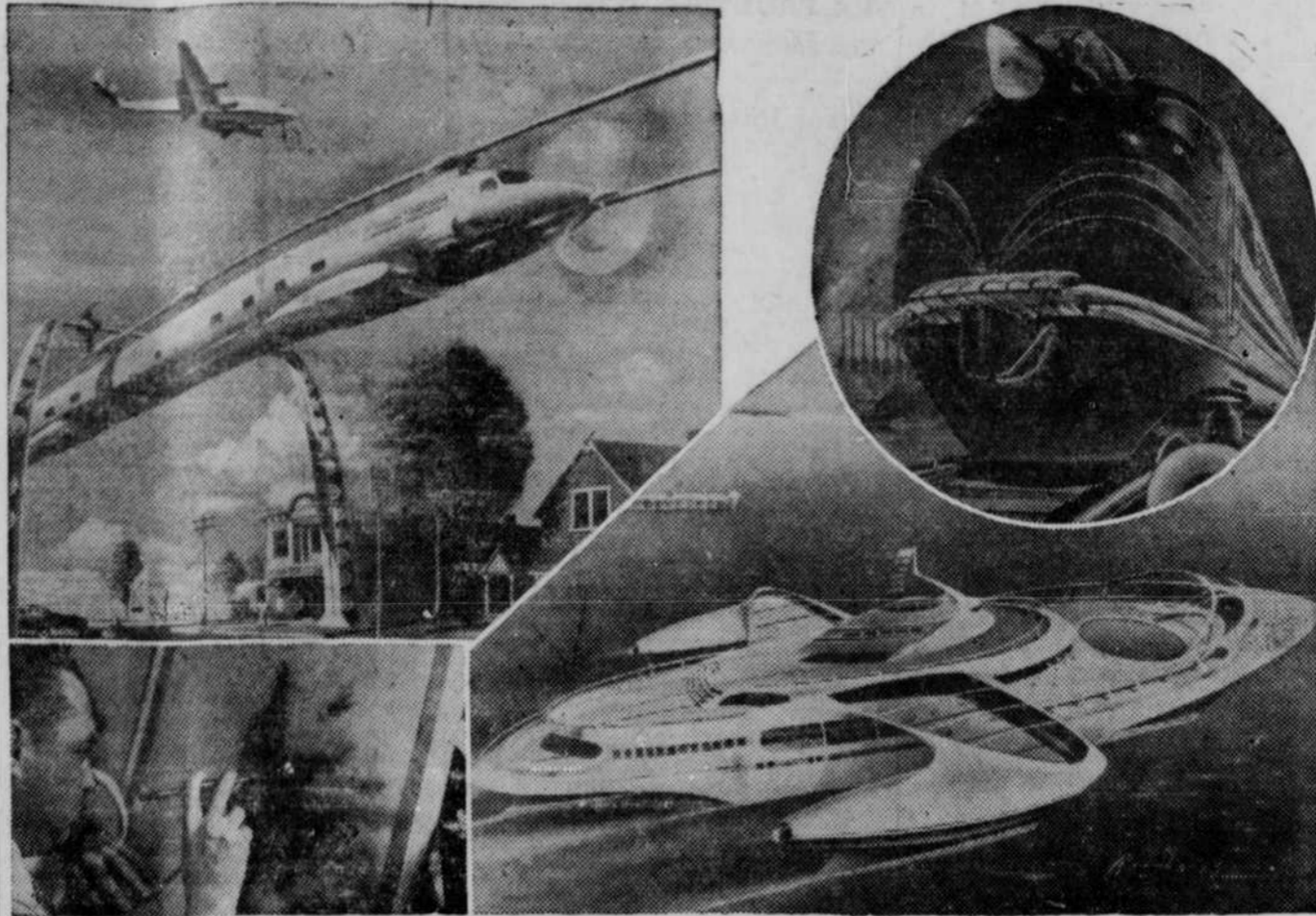
Platts Open New Chambers Firm
