HOLT COUNTY EDUCATIONAL NOTES

Only 14 rural schools have notified me that they have made contracts with teachers. This is an indication that qualified teachers are being slow in selecting schools probably on account of the uncertainty of wages. There are at least 50 qualified Holt county teachers who evidently have not contracted yet.

A check reveals that the following 1947 high school graduates in Holt county have completed their teachers' examination grades and averages: Vera Bert, of Stuart; Elaine Meyer and Dorothy Rash, of Atkinson; Charlotte Funk and Margaret Langan, of St. Mary's; Ardeth Ruroede, Bonnie Libby, Elsie Hobbs, Grace Latzel, Edith Helmricks and Leona Pribnow, of Ewing; Alta Boatman, Helen Burival, Cleora DeGroff, Mabel Derickson, Evelyn Lindberg and Carol Pruss, of O'Neill.

I shall appreciate notification of all teacher contracts signed. The next regular teachers' examination will be given in O'Neill on Saturday, July 19. Several more teachers will be qualified by that examination and at the end of the summer sessions in colleges.

Twenty-two former teachers have earned their six hours of college credit and can qualify for temporary certificates on August 1.

By July 1 all applications for free high school tuition should be in this office in order to determine the levy to be made for that purpose. An application is to be made each year for each rural student who desires high school privileges. Since the rate is higher this year than ever before it is that much more important to get all applications on file.
