Bill Tomlinson, who is here from the state of Washington, was a passenger with Max Grenier, O'Neill-Redbird mail carrier, June 16.

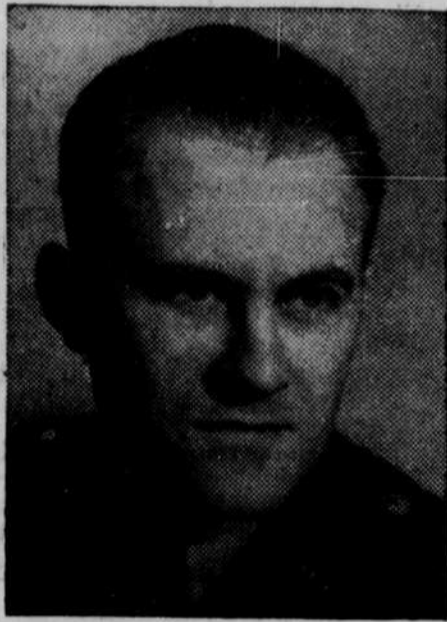
Mrs. Guy Pinkerman and Mrs. Ralph Pinkerman, of near Scottville, visited with Mrs. Pete More June 16.
