Holt-Boyd Rules Go Out Window

In a session of Holt-Boyd county baseball league officers and managers held here Monday night, the rules governing player eligibility were tossed out the window for the remainder of the season. This was decided after a four-hour session.

The Lynch entry in the league was charged with playing at least two athletes with affiliations outside the circuit. When the Holt-Boyd loop was formed two months ago a policy was adopted stipulating that "any player playing with another team" is ineligible for participation in the newly-formed loop.

The league-leading Lynch team was the only offender named at Monday's conference. With the bars down, nothing prevents any team from "spiking" for a crucial contest.

Fernau Presides
Monday's conference was held at the office of the Gergen Motor company in West O'Neill. James (Jim) Fernau, of Bristow, league vice-president, was in charge.

At the same time it was decided to play off postponed games on dates suiting the convenience of the league members.

An alternative to this plan was suggested. It called for completing first-half games before beginning the second-half.

An informal squabble in Sunday's Atkinson-Lynch game, won by Lynch 9-0, was reviewed, but because no formal protest had been filed no action was taken. Manager August Troshynski, of the Atkinson club, said that the third-inning decision wouldn't have affected the outcome any-

way, and so no protest was filed.

Atkinson players contended that a Lynch batter was out of the box and hit an illegal ball enabling a runner to score from third. Lynch contended that the Atkinson moundman was delivering a pitched ball, instead of playing on the runner stealing home, and the batter was in the box.

Second-half league play begins Sunday. (See the league standings, etc., below for the schedule.)
