### HOW TO MEASURE

FOR INSTALLATION INSIDE window frame, give us exact opening or space measure for width. Make no allowances—we make all necessary allowances. For length give exact height of opening from top to sill.

FOR INSTALLATION OUTSIDE facing of window frame, give us exact head width of blind required. Also give the full overall length of blind required.

PLEASE GIVE ALL MEASUREMENTS in inches and be sure to indicate which is width and which is length. Give distances from floor to sill so operating cords will be of proper length.
