er a certified copy of all of the records and proceedings which in any way affect the title of said property. It shall be further the duty of the secretary of said Board of Adjustment to make an accounting to the Mayor and Council of the City of O'Neill of all money so received and expended by him, at the first meeting in May of each and every year succeeding the date thereof.

(9) SAME, DWELLING REGULATIONS WITHIN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT. — Any dwelling house, or place of residence, that may hereafter be erected, or placed, upon any lot within Sub-District Number One of the Residential District of the City of O'Neill, shall be of not less than 350 square feet of first floor

area, exclusive of porches, whether they be open or enclosed porches; provided that no dwelling house, or residence, shall be constructed, or placed, upon any lot within Sub-district Number One of the Residential District of city, whose floor area shall be less than the average floor area of the houses now located on the same block that have 350 square feet or more of floor area on the first floor, exclusive of porches. It being intended that any house with less than 350 square feet of first floor area, and now located in such block, would not be included in reaching the above mentioned average. It is not the intention of this ordinance to place any restriction on the size of dwellings or residences erected or placed upon any lots in Sub-districts numbered two, three or four of this City.

(10) SAME, ASSESSORY BUILDINGS REGULATED WITHIN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT. — No dwelling house, or residence, shall be erected or placed upon any lot; or any garage or other accessory building shall be erected, or placed, upon any lot in Sub-district Number One of the Residential District of City, if the floor area of the proposed building, added to the floor area of buildings already existing on such lot, shall exceed 65% of the total area of the lot.

(11) SAME, VIOLATION OF PRECEDING SECTIONS, PENALTY. — Any person, firm or corporation, violating any of the preceding sections of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not less than Ten Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars; and shall pay the costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment thereof, shall stand committed to the City Jail until said fine and costs are paid, secured, or otherwise dis-

charged according to law; and each day of violation of any of the provisions of said ordinance shall be deemed a separate and distinct offense.

(12) REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT. — All ordinances and parts of ordinances passed and approved prior to the passage and approval of this ordinance and in conflict therewith are hereby repealed.

(13) WHEN OPERATIVE. — This ordinance shall be in full force and take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

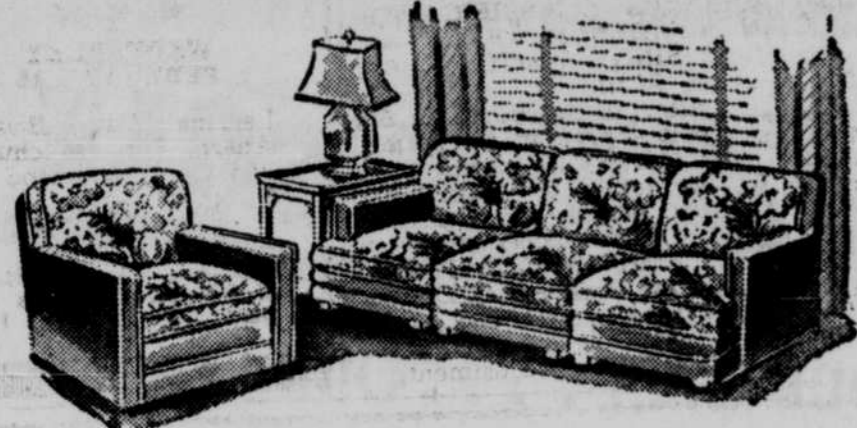
