

SUNDAY DRIVING IS DANGEROUS

Most Fatalities Occur Sundays; Thursdays Are Safest

Nebraska motorists have chalked up a new record. As of March 13, the state had gone 12 days without a fatal accident.

This announcement was made by E. P. Tinker, Jr., executive director of the Nebraska safety council. The previous record was broken by four days. The period considered was only post-war days. Previous marks had been set during war days when travel was restricted because of gasoline and tire rationing.

The new mark represents a saving of 15 lives thus far in 1948. Tinker said, "and if continued at its present rate of decrease will represent the realization of our goal to save 100 lives in 1948."

"Eight lives were saved in January, while February deaths were 4 above last year," Tinker continued. "Up until the 13th of March, we had only 1 fatality against 14 for 1947." In a study of the fatalities in 1947 by days of the week, it

was found that Sunday is the most dangerous day to drive. Thursday is the safest day. "Many drivers take to the roads on weekends who are not accustomed to traffic. These less experienced drivers taking to the highways at a time when traffic normally increases anyway, presents a dangerous condition which every driver should be fully aware of," Tinker

warned. "Under these conditions, emergencies frequently arise which can lead to severe accidents unless drivers are constantly alert and prepared to take defensive measures," he continued.

Sundays accounted for 58 fatalities during last year, with Saturdays second high with 51 deaths. Wednesdays were third high with 50 motorists killed. Other days were as follows: Tuesday, 48; Friday, 46; Monday, 45; and Thursday, 33.

Explaining the study, Tinker added: "Mondays show a drop but Tuesdays show a buildup toward the midweek high on Wednesday. Thursdays are comparatively safe with only 10 percent of the fatalities. Then the weekend buildup comes with Friday and Saturday showing increases toward the week's high on Sunday."

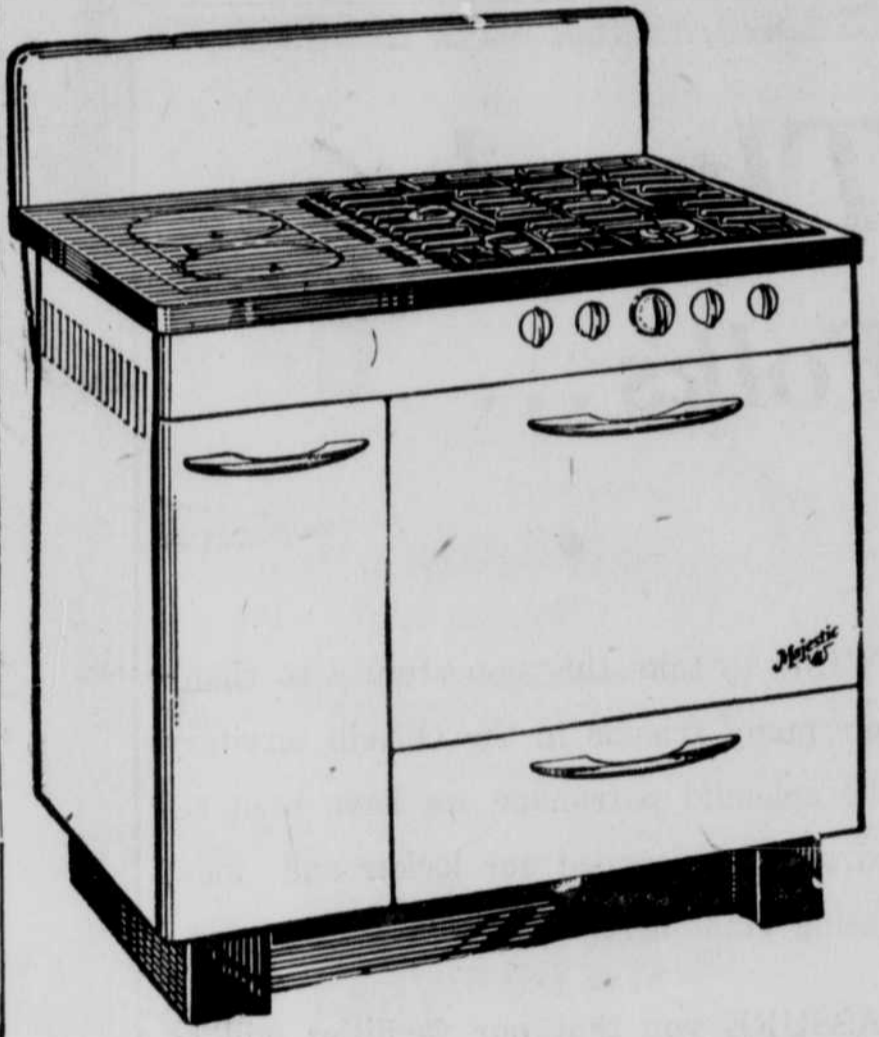
Ranch for Sale!
