Delbert Bunger, a Hildreth junior, proved a worthy running mate for the sharp Glen Einspahr, contributing 11 in addition to Einspahr's total of 17.

The Hildreth-Inman show was the class D inaugural.

The great Glen took over the offensive chores for the Greyhounds in the first quarter, and pushed the winners to an 8-5 first-quarter lead. Bunger handled the scoring burden during the second frame adding 7. His efforts were not enough to protect Hildreth's lead, however, as the Tigers rallied to move into a half-time tie, 15-all.

With the exception of one field goal and one gift toss, the boy named Glen furnished the third quarter fireworks for the Greyhounds, who gained a 25-20 margin.

Paul Hartigan paced Coach Ralph Gray's Tigers with 9 points, while Center Max Mossman, who worked hard under the basket for the losers, tallied 7.
