Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska;

1. That the alley running north and south across Block B in Goldens Subdivision of Blocks A and B, and the North Half of Block D in Fahys Second Addition to O'Neill, Nebraska, and which such alley is bordered on the West by Lots 5 and 12, and on the East by Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18 of said Block B, which alley runs through and intersects said Block B, be, and the same hereby is vacated, annulled and discontinued.

2. That a record of the vacation of the aforesaid alley be entered in the records of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska.

3. That a certified copy of this ordinance shall be furnished to the Register of Deeds of Holt County, Nebraska, and the same shall be recorded in such office.

4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.
