RADIO STATION TO AID FLIERS

Kansas City Soon May Become Mecca for Fog-Distressed Pilots

Kansas City—(UP)—Kansas City soon may become a mecca for the pilot distressed by poor visibility, fog, rain, approaching darkness, any of the perils which the airman faces.

Providing that he has a plane which is radio-equipped, the pilot will need only to head in the general direction of Kansas City, and then listen while an operator in the new airport radio station directs him to a landing.

Roy C. Farrell, airport manager, has announced plans for installation of the station, planned after a visit to the Cleveland airport, where he found such a station functioning efficiently.

The new station will be fully equipped to transmit and receive communications from planes.

Farrell said that many times such stations were used to tell pilots when to level off as they landed in murky weather, or to give other directions. The pilot would be informed regarding wind velocity to use, and given any other information needed.
