**EDUCATIONAL NOTES**  
(By the County Supt.)

The County Elimination Contest which was announced last week was held in the O'Neill Public School on Saturday morning. There were 14 entries from the Stuart Public School, St. Joseph's Hall Atkinson, Inman School, and St. Mary's Academy, O'Neill. The winners were chosen for the good health, mentality and personality. Out of a possible score of 290 Miss Violet Deming of the Stuart High School had a score of 245 25-42, Miss Mary Lois Hammond, St. Mary's Academy, 245 20-42, Elmer Alyn, Stuart High School, 232 11-42 and Robert McCarthy, St. Mary's Academy, 226 23-42. They will compete in a district tournament soon. The winners of the district contest will be the guests of the World-Herald and the American Legion at the Ak-Sar-Ben show in November.  
On November 10th the schools of

the County observed the Anniversary of the Surrender of Cornwallis. Where it was possible children listened to an address by President Hoover and at 10:35 saluted the flag and sang America.

Ten Christmas boxes have been filled by Junior Red Cross members in Holt County and have been sent to Red Cross headquarters.

Undoubtedly the youngest High School student in Holt county is enrolled in the Ewing High School. Frances Weibel, daughter of J. A. Weibel, is only eleven years of age and is doing fine work in the ninth grade. Frances will not be twelve years of age until February 7th.

Wednesday—Literature Dramatizations for 5th and 6th grades alternating with Literature and Art appreciation talks for Junior and Senior High Schools.  
Thursday—Primary Music and Dramatized Fairy Stories—every other week.  
Friday—Vocation Guidance and Civics.
