



DIME ON PLATE VANISHES AND IS FOUND UNDER PLATE



Prepare for this trick in the following manner: Lay a plate on a table, hide a dime under the plate and place a penny match box turned upside down beside the plate. Then gather your audience around the table, drop a dime on the plate and announce that you will make the dime disappear. Pick up the dime and spin it on the plate. While it is spinning quickly pick up the match box and pounce it down upon the dime. The dime will disappear when you raise the box, having been driven through the thin cover, where it is held as the box is taken away. With the audience wondering where the dime has gone, the performer lifts the plate and presto! what is believed to be the same dime is found beneath the plate. The reason for turning the match box upside down is that it is easier for the dime to penetrate the top of the box.

CLEVER TRICK PERFORMED WITH ORDINARY RULER



With an ordinary ruler in your hand announce to your audience that, without the use of glue or other adhesive material, you will make the ruler stick to the palm of your hand. Merely as a pretense rub the ruler on your knee and place it across the palm of your left hand which is held in a horizontal position. Grasping the wrist with your right hand slowly elevate the left arm, turning the back of the hand to the audience, and placing the index finger of the right hand over the ruler. The lending group, it was understood, will be known as the National Corn Credit corporation, with operatng branches in all corn belt areas.

The meeting was called by Earl Smith, president of the Illinois Agricultural association. Others attending were Charles R. Hearst, head of of the Iowafarm bureau; Mark Woods of Lincoln, Neb., and William H. Settle of Indianapolis.

Under the plan proposed the credit corporation would lend money only on corn held for market, eliminating holding a crop to feed for live stock. Loans would be made for nine months or less, inasmuch as the farm leaders do not want loans to be used to hold crops over for a season.
