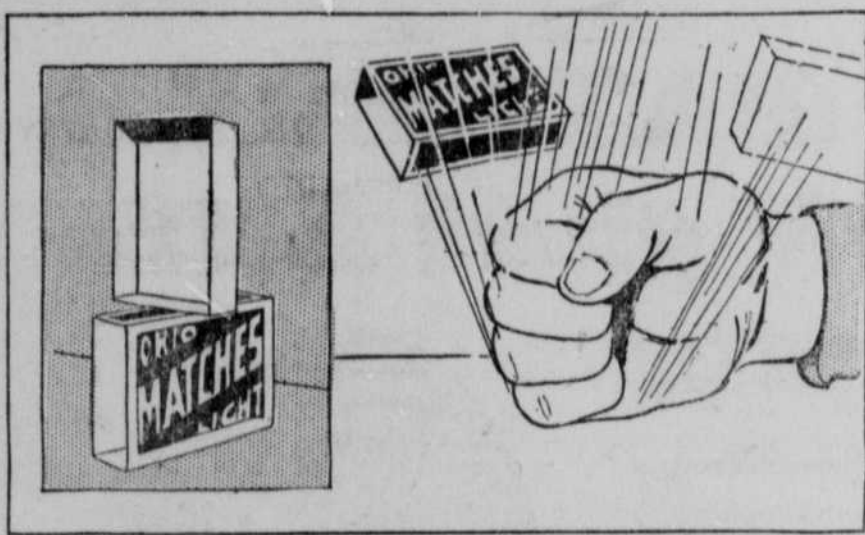

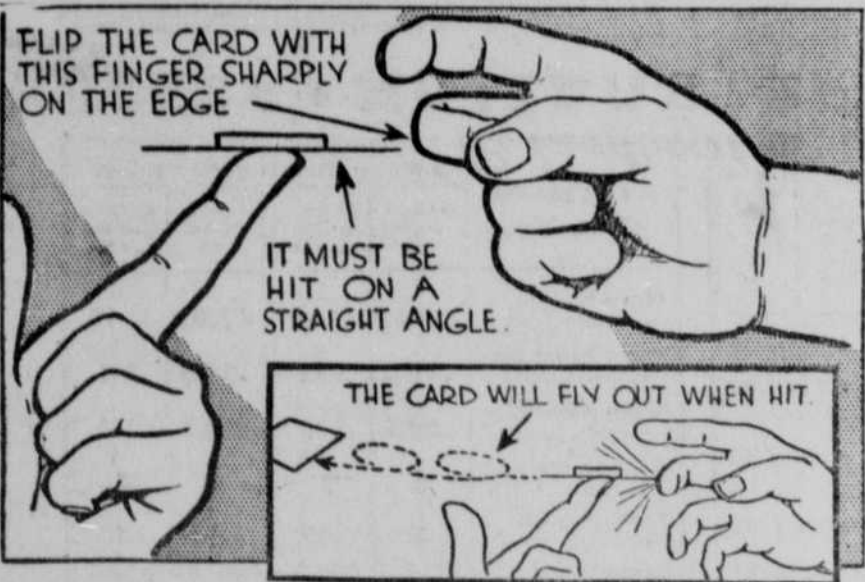
TRICK OF UNSMASHABLE MATCH BOX



Press two opposite corners of the cover of an ordinary penny match box so that it is slightly thrown out of square. Bring the box before your audience, stand the cover on its side, place the drawer upright on top of the cover, as shown in the drawing, and ask some one to try to crush it with a blow of the hand. It will be found that the two parts of the box fly in separate directions when the hand comes in contact with them.

TAKING CARD FROM UNDER QUARTER WITHOUT MOVING COIN



Place a quarter in the center of a small card about two inches square and balance the card on the tip of the index finger of your left hand. The quarter, in the center of the card, will then be directly above the finger tip, with the card between it and the finger. The trick is to remove the card without moving the quarter. This is done by flipping the card sharply on the edge with the middle finger of the right hand. As the card is hit it will fly out from under the quarter, leaving the quarter balanced on the finger tip. It is necessary to strike the card sharply on a straight or horizontal angle.

Forest Tree Seedlings Available

Tree planting stock can be secured for reforestation projects. Applications for the use of seedlings for wind-break plantings around school grounds will be approved this year.

Trees will be distributed only in bundles of 100 of each variety. The number of trees available for each applicant will be governed by the supply. This information is not available as yet. The trees will be packed at Halsey and shipped about April 1st. Farmers wishing application blanks write this office. The blanks will be received here in about two weeks. They will be furnished to applicants in the order that the applications are received.

New Circular on Wheat Recipes Available

"Appetizing Cracked Wheat Recipes", an emergency circular issued by the Extension service, is now available for free distribution thru county extension agents or at the Agricultural College.

Hay Grading Meetings

O. E. Pollock, chief of the Hay, Feed and Seed office of Kansas City, will address a series of four hay meetings in the Elkhorn Valley. The purpose of the meetings is to show the producer the value of the Federal hay grades.

The first meeting will be held at the town hall at Newport at 1:30 P. M. on Tuesday November 10th. The second meeting will be at the George Collin's garage in Atkinson at 1:30 P. M. Wednesday, November 11th. The third meeting will be at Ryan's hay barns in O'Neill at 1:30 P. M. Thursday, November 12th. The last meeting will be at Watson's hay barns in Inman at 1:30 P. M. Friday, November 13th.

The practical grading of hay will be demonstrated by Federal licensed graders. They will grade a number of samples of hay at each meeting. These meetings will be of interest to all producers and they are invited to attend one of the meetings.

Turkey Pool Plans Cancelled

Turkey producers of the county did not show enough interest in plans for pooling turkeys to warrant trying out the plan. If enough interest is shown before the Christmas market a pooling plan may be worked out.
