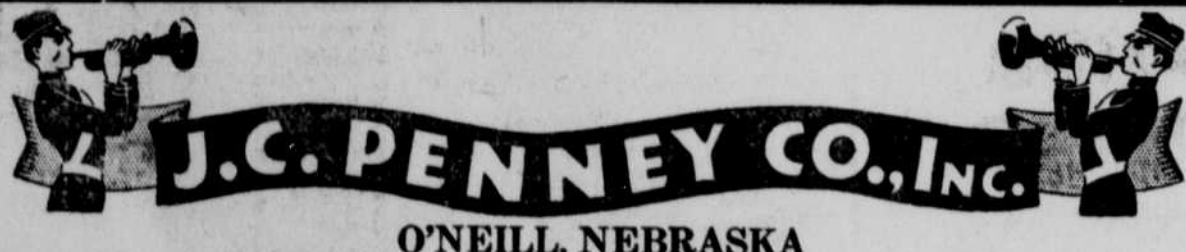

ORDER

Gibson, is now entitled to receive a mother's pension; and that the allegations of her petition heretofore filed, the Court finds now to be true; her condition having changed since the former hearing.

On consideration whereof it is ordered that a mother's pension be granted to Mary E. Gibson for \$10.00 a month, commencing May first, 1932, and continuing for six months; and the same to be paid to her monthly.

It is further ordered by the Court that the board of supervisors of Holt County, Nebraska, enter an order directing the payment of said pension; and that the Clerk of this Court deliver to the County a certified copy of this order.
