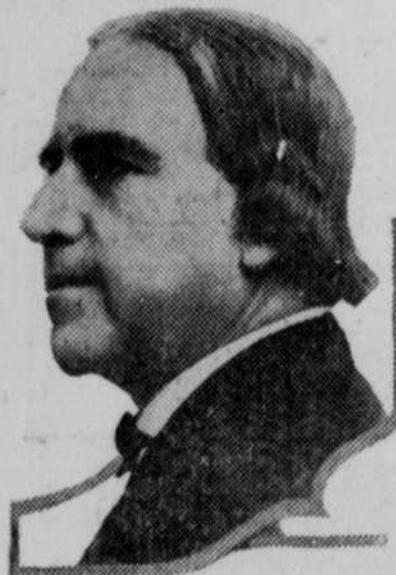

Holt county on a county commodity and resource exhibit at the Ak-Sar-Ben Live Stock Show. This exhibit will feature the production of prairie hay in the county. A miniature hay scene with trucks moving on endless belts will help add to the attractiveness of the exhibit. Folders advertising the value of Holt county hay will be distributed at the exhibit booth during Ak-Sar-Ben. The County Agent and members of the Elkhorn Valley Hay Association will be at the Booth at all times to talk to visitors. This exhibit should prove of benefit to the county and the advertising value will mean considerable to the farmers and hay dealers of the county.

**Women's Project Clubs to Meet**

The women's project clubs of the county will meet at the World Memorial hall in Atkinson on Thursday, November 3rd at 10:00 o'clock. **Frosted Sudan May Be Dangerous**

Sudan grass which has absolutely no cane in it can be pastured with only a reasonable degree of safety after a frost. There seems to be a number of instances on record where pure sudan has developed prussic acid under drouth and frosted conditions and the acid has caused losses of livestock. The safest thing to do is not to pasture the sudan after a hard freeze or frost but allow the growth to cure in the field after which it can be pastured off with safety. At the Agricultural College in Lincoln, the livestock men have pastured sudan after a frost for several years without any trouble from poisoning. Many farmers have reported no trouble, but a few suffered losses due to poison.

Holt County Board of Supervisors met as per adjournment. All members present. Meeting called to order by the Chairman. Minutes of previous meeting were read and, on motion, were approved as read.

At this time, the Board took up the matter of considering the petition filed as a remonstrance to appropriating funds for the continuance of the office of County Agent.

The remonstrances petition containing 43 pages and 385 signers, and which petition was filed in the office of the County Clerk on September 16, 1932, was presented at this meeting and read in full.

Representatives of the Holt County Farm Bureau, as also representatives of the Taxpayers League appeared before the Board and presented each side of the case to the Board.

The Supplementary petition of the Holt County Farm Bureau, containing 3 4pages and 279 new names, and which petition was filed in the office of the County Clerk on September 1, 1929, was presented and read at this meeting in full. Motion by James seconded by Steinhauser, that this supplementary petition be not considered in this matter. This motion, on being put to a vote by the Chairman, was declared carried.

Lists were then presented by the Farm Bureau showing minors, duplications of names, and persons deemed to be ineligible to sign the remonstrance, which lists were checked over and taken under advisement for consideration in determining the sufficiency of names on the remonstrance.

pertaining to the office of County Agent were also read at this meeting. Action on this matter was laid over for further consideration.

Mr. John Robertson appeared before the Board in regard to building a dike along the Beaver Creek in Cleveland Precinct for the purpose of diverting channel and protecting overflow.

Whereas, we, the Board of Supervisors of Holt county, Nebraska, find that in accordance with Section 2-1101 compiled statutes of Nebraska for 1929, there was filed in 1930 in the office of the County Clerk of Holt county, Nebraska, as provided by law at that time, a petition containing 667 signers asking the County Board of Holt county, Nebraska, to appropriate a sum of money as provided by law for the purpose of maintaining a County Agricultural Agent, and,  
Whereas, such allowance has been made by the County Board each succeeding year upon the proper request filed by the County Farm Bureau, and,  
Whereas, there was filed in the office of the County Clerk on the 16th day of September 1932, a remonstrance petition against the further allowance of said budget, which remonstrance petition contains 828 legal signers, being more than one-eighth more names than the original petition.

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the County Clerk of Holt county, Nebraska, be and he hereby is ordered and directed to submit the question to a vote of the people of the County at the General Election held therein in the year 1932.
