RESOLUTION

Whereas, there is now pending in the District Court of Holt county, Nebraska, a suit brought by William J. Hammond, as assignee of a number of claims filed against the County by Physicians and surgeons, based on claims for medical supplies furnished by them to the County:

And whereas all of the services for which claims were filed by such persons were furnished at the request and at direction of The County of Holt and ordered to be furnished by its officers,

And whereas, this Honorable Body has heretofore disallowed said claims not because the same are not just claims against the County, but there was no money or funds available out of which to pay the same;

And whereas, all of said claims, and each and every item thereof, have been carefully checked and audited by this Board and have been found to be proper, and all of the services for which claims were filed were furnished by such claimants and the charges are correct and proper charges and in accordance with contracts, and the auditing committee of this Board had checked said claims and found them to be proper and the allowance thereof has been recommended by such committee;

And whereas it is to the best interest of the County and the taxpayers thereof that no little expense be made in connection with said suit as is possible.

Therefore, I move that the County Attorney be advised of the facts in connection with all of said claims, and that he be instructed to make no expense in the matter of resisting said suit and that he be instructed to permit judgment to be entered thereon.

SALES TAX FOR NEBRASKA (Continued from page 5.) trucks and tractors, on which the rate of 1 per cent is fixed.

Utility services (publicly owned plants exempt) water, sewage and street railway, 2 per cent; electricity and gas, 1 per cent for industrial purposes and 2 per cent for domestic use; telegraph and telephone, 2 per cent; railroads, sleeping car and express companies, 2 per cent; oil and gas pipe lines, 2 per cent; motor bus and taxi cab operators, 2 per cent (except for transporting school children under contract.)

Contracting—1 per cent. Other professional, business or trade activities—2 per cent. Every person, firm, or association subject to the tax must take out a yearly license from the state tax commissioner, paying \$1 annual fee.

THE MATTER OF OLD AGE PENSIONS. W. E. Sutton in Muncie, Ind., Press: Sponsored by the Fraternal Order of Eagles, a bill will be introduced into the Indiana General Assembly to provide pensions for the aged.

Seven or more states now have such a law. The Eagles say that it is less expensive to care for old persons by the pension system than to maintain almshouses. That, of course, is a matter for consideration in these times when we have to think of dollars and cents more importantly than we did in more prosperous times, but, after all, it is the human side of the thing that deserves greatest thought.

One does not deserve a living from the bare fact that he is old, but he may deserve such a living if he has lived a useful life. How are we going to differentiate between the classes of the deserving and the undeserving?

Old age is not, of itself, a mark of distinction except as years may convey distinction by the sheer fact of them. All of us know old persons who have gone through life serving their families and others well without the possibility of financial profit who should be entitled to some help in the lean years of their life, but we also know those of other kinds that are deserving of nothing except being taken away from their surroundings.

We have to wonder how the bill which is to come before the legislature will be worded. It is easy enough to become sentimental about old persons but, really, if we are going to be that way, they should be worthy old persons.

The thing about it all is that age is not necessarily a meritorious thing. Everybody attains it who lives long enough.
