IN THE DISTRICT COURT OF HOLT COUNTY, NEBRASKA In the Matter of Applications for Mother's Pensions.

ORDER

Now on this 26th day of April, 1933, the matter of the renewal of mother's pensions came before the court for consideration; on consideration of the petitions, the evidence, and the recommendations of the county board of supervisors, it appears to the court that mother's pensions should be renewed for a period of six months, and granted the following named mothers in the amount set opposite their names, to-wit:

That the application of Ruby Wilcox be continued until the next meeting of the board of supervisors on May 2nd, 1933. That the application of Karoline E. Mikus be granted in the sum of \$10.00 for the month of May, and for no longer a period.

It is further ordered by the Court that the pension granted to Addie Bowden be paid to her mother, Mrs. Hicks, of O'Neill; who is the grandmother of Addie Bowden's children, and they being in the custody of Mrs. Hicks. That if Mrs. Bowden fails to pay to Mrs. Hicks toward the support of said children the sum of \$4.00 per week then that this pension granted to Addie Bowden be discontinued.

It is further ordered that the pension granted to Clara May Holden be paid to her mother Mary Spence, and by her expended for the use and benefit, support, education and maintenance of the children of the said Clara May Holden.

The Court finds that Nettie Caulfield is entitled to a mother's pension, and that her petition filed in this Court April 6, 1933, should be granted; and she is hereby allowed the sum of \$10.00 per month for six months, payable each month, and until the further order of the Court.

It is further ordered that the board of supervisors make an order directing the payments of the aforesaid mother's pensions as directed by the Court.
