As Eli's Poloists Bowed to Tigers



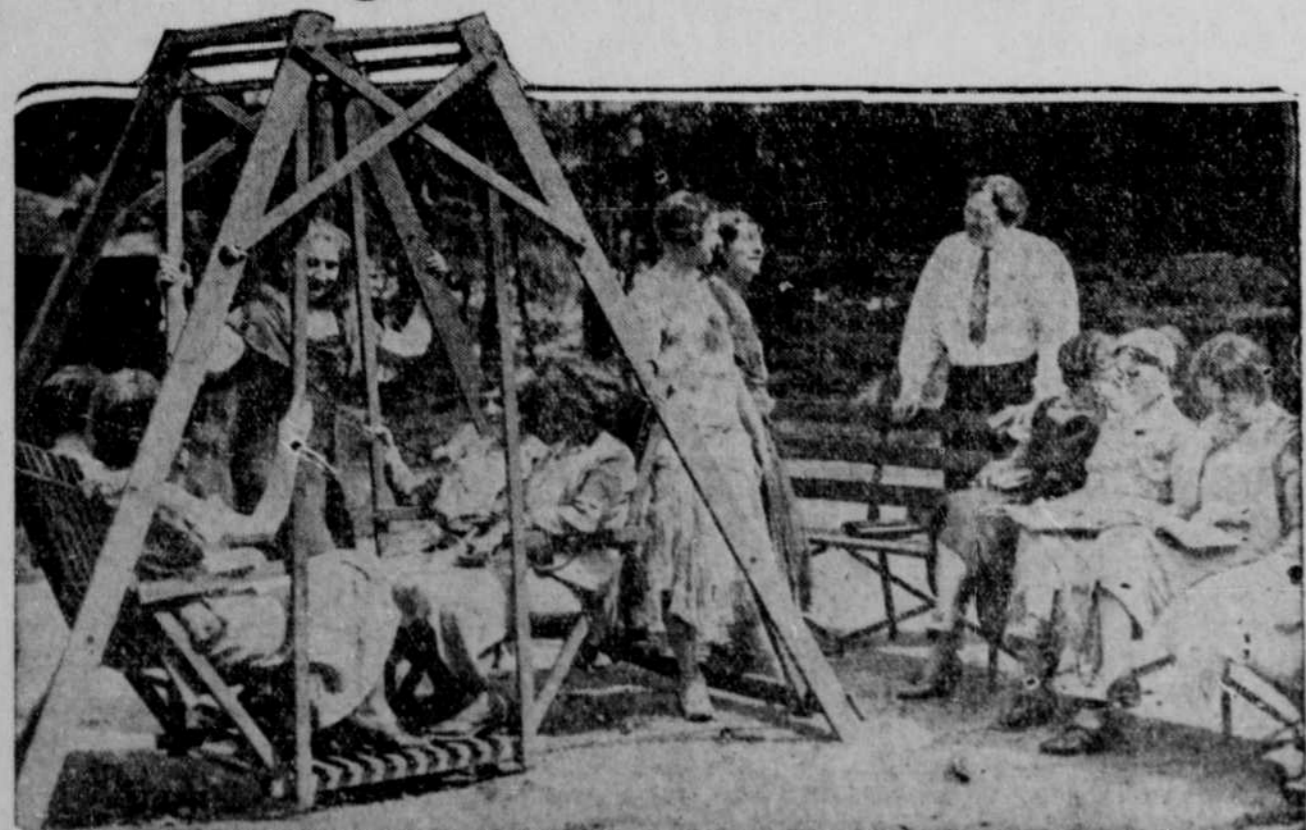
