ORDINANCE NUMBER 140A
An ordinance to provide for regulating and licensing dry cleaning establishments or laundries, operating or soliciting business within the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, where no dry cleaning plant or laundry is maintained and operated within said City and providing a penalty for violation of this ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'NEILL, NEBRASKA:
Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to solicit business within the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, for any dry cleaning establishment or laundry which does not maintain and operate a cleaning plant or laundry within said City, without first having procured a license, as hereinafter provided, and paying license fee of \$5.00 per day.

Section 2. Any person, firm or corporation desiring a license to solicit business, as aforesaid, shall make application in writing to the City Clerk, setting forth the name and residence of the applicant, and the name and the location of the dry cleaning establishment or laundry for which such business is to be solicited. Said City Clerk, upon the payment of license fee here-in provided for, shall issue a license

which shall state the name of the persons licensed, the name and location of the dry cleaning establishment or laundry and the duration of the license.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00 and shall pay the costs of prosecution and stand committed to the city jail until the fine and costs are paid.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 139A

An Ordinance Providing for a Levy to Raise Funds by Taxation on Property Situated Within the Corporate Limits of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, for the Fiscal Year Beginning the First Tuesday in May, 1933, and Ending on the First Tuesday in May, 1934.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'NEILL, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. That the City of O'Neill, Nebraska make the following levy for taxation for the fiscal year beginning the first Tuesday in May, 1933, and ending on the first Tuesday in May, 1934, on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska:

For general purposes, 5 mills on the dollar.
For street lighting, 3 mills on the dollar.

For re-funding bond, interest and sinking fund, 2 1/2 mills on the dollar.
For water bond, interest and sinking fund, 1/2 mill on the dollar.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 141A

An Ordinance Relating to Liquors:

To Define Intoxicating Liquors: To Provide Rules and Regulations for and to License the Sale of Beer and Other Malt, Brewed and Fermented Beverages Containing More Than One-Half of One Per Cent of Alcohol by Volume and Not To Exceed 3.2% of Alcohol by Weight and for Permits and Licenses to Do So: To Provide for the Levying and Collection of an Occupation Tax Upon Licensees Hereunder, and to Impose A Penalty for Any Violation of the Provisions of this Ordinance: To Repeal Ordinance No. 83-A of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'NEILL, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. The term "beverages" as used in this ordinance shall be construed to be the same as defined by Section 53-101, Compiled Statutes of Nebraska for 1929, as amended by House Roll 585 of the Forty-ninth Session of the Legislature of the State of Nebraska.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to manufacture for sale, sell or barter any malt, spirituous, vinous and intoxicating liquors within the corporate limits of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, except as provided by the general laws of the State of Nebraska. Intoxicating liquor is defined to be any liquor containing more than 3.2 per centum of alcohol by weight.

Section 3. A license may be issued after 12:01 A. M. on August 10, 1933, by the City Council of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, for the manufacture or sale of beverages within said City under the following conditions only:

A. Any applicant for a license shall file with the City Clerk of said City an application for the kind of license desired in such form as shall be prescribed by the director of the department of agriculture an inspection of the State of Nebraska, together with a bond in the sum of \$500.00 for the faithful performance of the terms of said license as provided by Section 12 of House Roll No. 585 of the Forty-ninth Session of the Legislature of the State of Nebraska.

B. After the filing with the City Clerk of the application and bond, mentioned in sub-division A hereof, the City Council at any regular or special meeting shall consider such application and shall vote to either grant or refuse such application for license. If a majority of the City Council shall vote in favor of the

granting of such license, the City Clerk shall issue such license upon a form to be furnished by the Director of the Department of Agriculture and Inspection of the State of Nebraska upon presentation by the applicant of the receipt of the City Treasurer showing the payment of license fee as provided by the laws of the State of Nebraska.

C. Such license shall be good for only one year from the date of its issuance unless sooner revoked and shall be at all times displayed in a conspicuous place in the place of business of such licensee.

Section 4. For the purpose of raising revenue there is hereby levied an occupation tax of \$25.00 per year upon each person who sells the beverages described in this ordinance.

Section 5. The violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof the defendant shall be fined in any sum not exceeding \$100.00 and his license shall stand revoked.

Section 6. Ordinance No. 83-A of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, is hereby repealed.

Section 7. No person shall manufacture for sale, sell or offer for sale any of the beverages described in this ordinance without having obtained a license so to do.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, approval and publication, according to law; no license shall be granted hereunder before 12:01 A. M., on the 10th day of August, 1933.
