ORDINANCE NO. 142 "A."

An Ordinance authorizing the making and entering into of a contract between the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, and the United States of America. Whereas the City of O'Neill has heretofore made application to the United States of America for a grant under the provisions of Title II, National Industrial Recovery Act, ap-TO THE PEOPLE OF O'NEILL proved June 16, 1933, (which application has been numbered by the United States of America as Docket Number 2061) and such application has been the people of O'Neill, both within and granted in a sum not exceeding \$1,500. And whereas a contract embodying the terms and conditions of said grant has been submitted to said City of O'Neill,

And whereas the City of O'Neill has agreed to the terms and conditions of said contract as submitted.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'NEILL, NE-BRASKA.

Section 1. That the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, enter into the contract submitted by the United States of America

Section 2. That said contract shall be executed on behalf of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, by being signed by its Mayor and attested by its City Clerk and that the corporate seal of said City of O'Neill be affixed to said contract.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
