 TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Under provisions of Chapter 7 of the Laws of Nebraska for 1925, a petition has been filed with the Director of the State Department of Agriculture and Inspection containing the signatures of sixty per cent (60%) or more of the breeding cattle herd owners, representing (51%) of the breeding cattle as disclosed by the last assessment rolls of Holt county, requesting the tuberculin testing of all cattle herds within such county. As required by State Law, a public hearing will be held at the office of the Director of the State Department of Agriculture and Inspection in the Capitol Building, Lincoln, Nebraska, at 10:00 A. Any objections that are held against this petition and the request made should be filed with the Director on or before that date, or those who would file such objections should appear at this hearing to present cause for not accepting the petition filed as being insufficient to satisfy the statutes.
