NEW MARKET FOR NEBRASKA ALFALFA SEED A new market for Nebraska-grown alfalfa seed is indicated by recent activities of the Amtorg Trading Corporation in this region, according to the state department of agriculture and inspection.

They demand the very highest quality of seed and only fifty per cent of the samples tested met the requirements of their representatives. They insisted that the germination, including the hard seeds, should be 90% or better, and would not accept lots that contained noxious weeds.
