Whereas, the Interstate Power company of Nebraska, a Deleware Corporation, is desirous of furnishng electric energy to pump water for municipal purposes within the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, at the umping station situate on the folving described premises, to-wit:

hereto shall hold the other free and harmless of and from all liability, damages, actions and causes of action caused by or through the ownership, maintenance or operation of its electric property and equipment and such division of liability shall be at the point of delivery as herein-

above provided. X. That this agreement shall be and remain in full force and effect for a period of Five (5) years from and after the date hereof; provided, that the term hereof shall be extended an additional five (5) years if the Municipality shall not within sixty (60) days prior to the expiration hereof notify the Company in writing of its desire to terminate the same at the end of said Five (5) years. XI. That all contracts and agreements, written or oral,

heretofore existing between the parties hereto and covering the subject matter hereof, (if there be any such), are hereby cancelled and the Municipality hereby represents that it has by appropriate action repealed or amended all ordinances, resolutions and rules, or parts thereof, heretofore adopted by it in conflict with the terms hereof.

XII. That the Municipality represents that this agreement has been duly authorized by a majority vote of its Council in accordance with the Statutes of the State of Nebraska, and certified copies of the proceedings therefor shall be promptly furnished to the Company for approval of its counsel.

XII. That if any Section or part of a Section of this agreement shall be declared null and void by any competent authority the remaining portions hereof shall not be affected thereby.


