



Soak the brickwork with water and then pack with a mixture of one part cement, one part hydrated lime and five parts clean, coarse building sand, adding only enough water to make a workable mixture. You can get a colorless waterproof coating or cement base paint to apply to the chimney.

Roof Gutters

Question: Is it advisable to use asphalt paint on the inside of roof gutters, and does the paint dry hard? Can the outside of the gutters be coated with the same material?

Answer: Yes, it is advisable to coat the inside of the gutters with an asphalt paint. They will remain more flexible and will not be affected by water over long periods of time. Use a good quality outside house paint on the outside of the gutter. But if it is made of galvanized metal, first coat the metal with red-lead paint. New galvanized metal should be allowed to weather for six months or more before painting.

Holes in Roof Gutter

Question: Is there any way of repairing small holes in a metal roof gutter without taking it down?

Answer: Clean the area around the holes. Then spread on some asphalt roofing cement and place a piece of heavy asphalt felt over the holes. Then spread more of the roofing cement over the felt. Another method is to clean the metal and solder a metal patch over the

Split-Rail Fence

Answer: Yes, two coats of a good quality creosote shingle stain will preserve the wood. If you do not object to a brown color, you can apply a soaking coat of coal-tar creosote.

One of the ideas we had as boys at high school was that any boy with blackheads or pimples could not be as clean about his body as he should be. If he would wash his skin with soap and water, and perhaps use a skin brush, he would remove the blackheads from his "pores" and the skin of would come out on the surface of the skin. Today we know that having pimples and blackheads is not a matter of cleanliness, but is caused by gland changes in the body which interfere with the proper use of certain kinds of foods, usually fats and starches. Fortunately, acne was not thought due to any lack of intelligence in these students with acne because their class standing was at least equal to that of the class average.

In the army, in schools or other institutions, patients suffering with scabies (the itch) have usually been considered of low intelligence despite the fact that there were so many exceptions.

In the British Lancet, Drs. K. Mellanby, A. L. Northedge and C. Johnson report the results of their investigations as to the intelligence of several hundred patients suffering with scabies. The results of this investigation showed that men with scabies were mentally a normal sample from the army. There was nothing to suggest that the group suffering with scabies had a larger percentage with low intelligence than those not afflicted with scabies.

"There was no significant difference in intelligence between men who reported themselves sick, those who were discovered during the regular or routine physical inspections, those with a few parasites or those with or without infection following an attack of scabies."

From the above we learn that the parasite, the itch mite, the female of which buries itself under the skin, giving the appearance of scratches. makes no special choice as to its victims. The itching is due to substances given off by the parasites and their eggs.
