Lunch was served after the meeting. The next meeting will be with Donald and Doris Stearns.—Richard Hynes, Reporter.

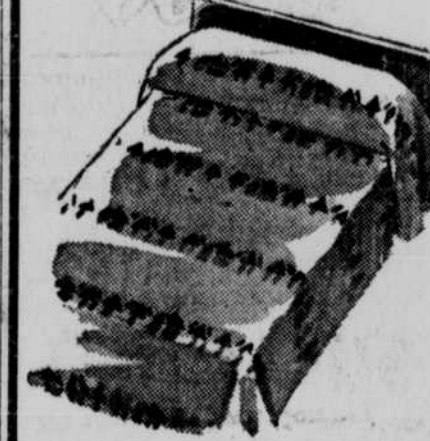
