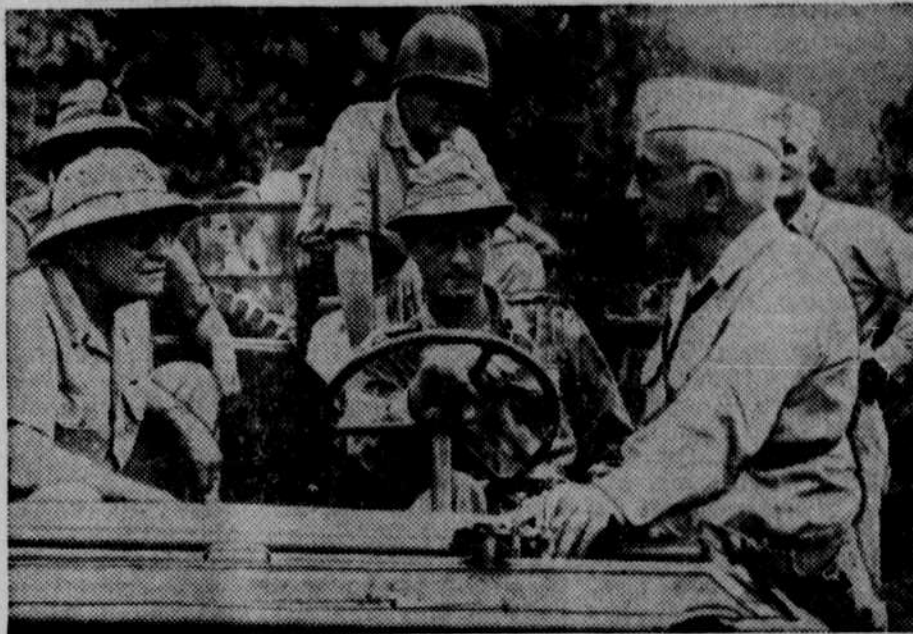

Admirals Tour Green Island



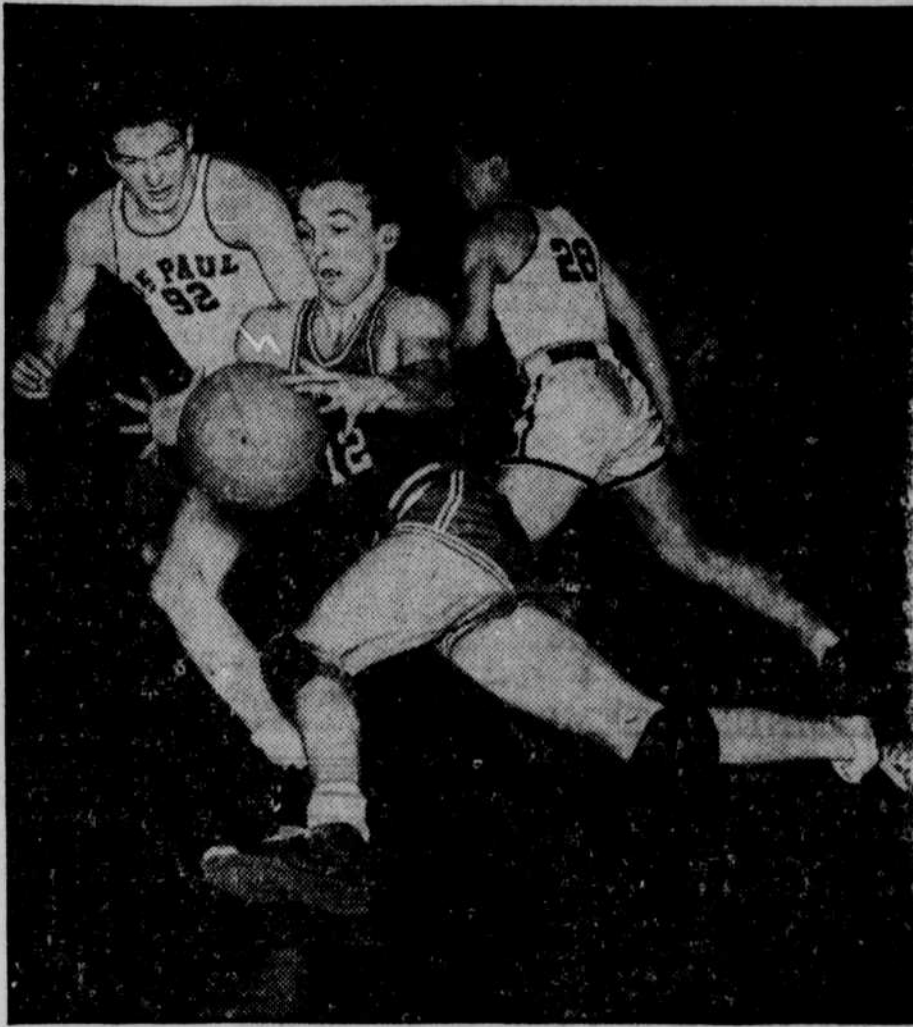

Stump Didn't 'Stump' This Play



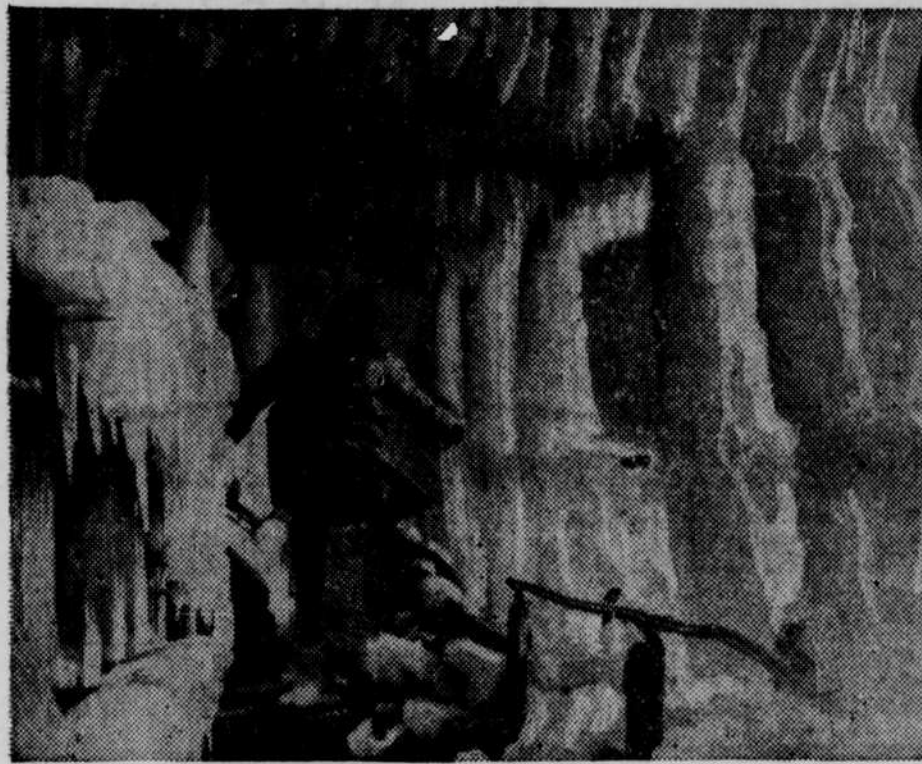
