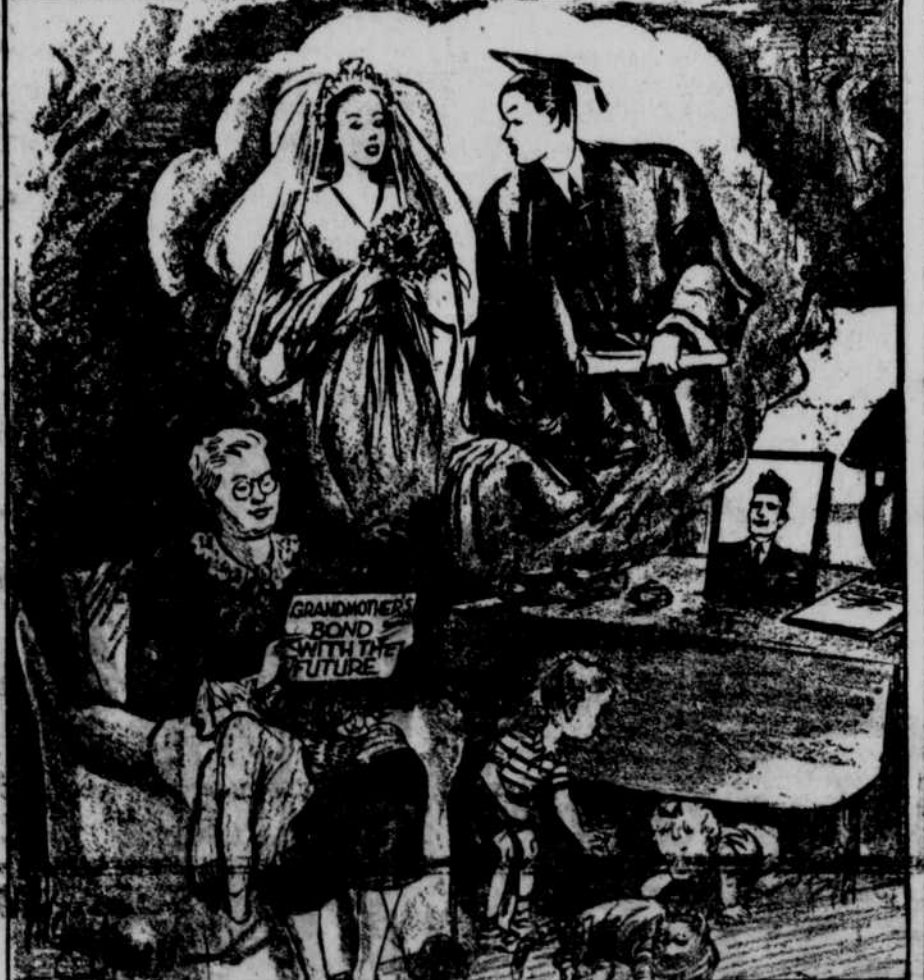

ORDINANCE NO. 210-A An Ordinance providing for a levy to raise funds by taxation on property situated within the corporate limits of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, for the fiscal year beginning the first Tuesday in May, 1944, and ending the first Tuesday in May, 1945. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF O'NEILL, NEBRASKA: Section 1. That the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, make the following levy for taxation for the fiscal year beginning the first Tuesday in May, 1944, and ending the first Tuesday in May, 1945, on the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska: For general purposes, 5 mills on the dollar. For street lighting, 2.8 mills on the dollar. For refunding bonds, interest and sinking fund 2.5 mills on the dollar. For support of the band, .5 mills on the dollar. For maintenance and improvements of the City Park, 1 mill on the dollar. Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication as provided by law: Passed this 19th day of April, A. D., 1944. JOHN KERSENBRACK, Mayor. Attest: J. B.
