300 YES AN ACT to prohibit the manufacture, sale, transportation, importation, advertising, possession or use of intoxicating liquors as a beverage, and to repeal the existing liquor laws of the State of Nebraska set forth in Chapter 116, Laws of Nebraska for 1935, and all amendments thereto.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION

302 YES AN AMENDMENT to Section 1, Article VIII, of the Constitution of Nebraska, so as to provide that all of the net proceeds derived from motor vehicle registration fees, motor vehicle license taxes, and all excise taxes levied upon gasoline and other motor vehicle fuels used in motor vehicles in the State of Nebraska shall be appropriated and used for the purpose of constructing, repairing and maintaining public high-
