ment Division of the Treasury  
 Department. Food products are  
 under the War Food Administra-  
 tion, government plants come un-  
 der the jurisdiction of the Recon-  
 struction Finance Corporation,  
 and everything that floats, the  
 Maritime Commission. The gov-  
 ernment does not sell to individ-  
 ual users but to dealers in the  
 normal trade channels, and to  
 government agencies and subdivi-  
 sions.  
 Treasury Procurement officials  
 tell me that they are preparing  
 lists of all farm equipment deal-  
 ers in the United States so that  
 they can keep them informed of  
 the things they have for sale. They  
 suggest that anyone who wants  
 certain kinds of equipment, mach-  
 inery or vehicles should contact  
 their dealers in their own com-  
 munities and urge them to get in  
 touch with Treasury Procurement  
 Regional Offices in their territory.  
 The Regional Office for Nebraska  
 is at 2605 Walnut Street, Kansas  
 City 8, Missouri. The Division  
 publishes the Surplus Reporter  
 which lists the property for sale  
 and tells how to acquire it. I re-  
 ceive the Surplus Reporter regu-  
 larly and have noticed many items  
 that could be used by people.

**CONFIDENTIAL**  
 The tendency of executive agen-  
 cies of government to suppress  
 information about their activities,  
 except that which they want to  
 use for propaganda purposes  
 brought about an incident that  
 aroused the ire of Congressman  
 Tarver, Democrat from Georgia,  
 who heads one of the sub-com-  
 mittees of the House Appropria-  
 tions Committee. He had request-  
 ed information from the Foreign  
 Economic Administration on the  
 extent of exports of farm mach-  
 inery. The report he received  
 was marked "Confidential". It  
 made him so mad he placed the  
 entire report in the Congressional  
 Record.  
 The report showed that 1944  
 exports of farm machinery were  
 nearly double those of 1943. A  
 total of 247,376 farm tractors  
 were produced in the United  
 States in 1944 of which 41,037  
 were exported. We produced 308,-  
 228 plows of which 35,004 were  
 exported. The lists of exports in-  
 cluded 11,531 harrows, 5,406  
 drills, 13,761 cultivators, 1,587  
 grain binders, 1,222 combines, to  
 name some of them. If the action  
 of FEA is defensible in this mat-  
 ter it should have no hesitancy  
 in making the figures public. In  
 view of the food situation in the  
 United States the people should  
 know what their government is  
 doing along this line.
