ORDINANCE NO. 216-A
 An Ordinance to repeal Ordinance No. 214-A of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska; to revise and amend Ordinance No. 157-A of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska; to provide and regulate the hours of opening and closing, and the hours for doing business on certain days for retail liquor establishments, including beer, within the City of O'Neill, Nebraska.
 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'NEILL, NEBRASKA:
 Section 1. That Ordinance No. 214-A of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, be, and it is, repealed.
 Section 2. That Ordinance No. 157-A of the City of O'Neill, Nebraska, be, and it is amended to read as follows: "Section 4. No person shall, within such city sell at retail any alcoholic liquors, including beer, on the day of any national, state, county, or municipal election, including primary election, during the hours the polls are open in said city. No person shall within said city sell at retail any alcoholic liquors, including beer, on any day after the hour of 12:00 Midnight, or between the hours of 12:00 Midnight, and 6:00 A. M. No person shall within said city sell at retail any alcoholic liquors, excepting between the hours of 6:00 A. M. and 12:00 A. M., of such day.
 Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after passage and publication as provided by law.
