SENATORIAL CONVENTION.

The Democracy of the 21st Senatorial District, viz., Adams, Webster, Nuckolls, and Pawnee counties, will hold a Senatorial Convention at R. I. Cloud on Wednesday Sept. 26th 1876 at 1 o'clock P. M. to nominate a candidate for State Senator.

The basis of representation is as follows: One delegate for every two votes cast at the last state election in 1875, and one delegate for any fraction exceeding six-tenths.

The Convention will choose a senatorial central committee, and transact any other business that may come before the convention.

Proceedings of the Republican Convention of the 21st Senatorial District, held at Red Cloud, Sept. 9th A. D. 1876, for the purpose of placing in nomination a candidate for State Senator for the 21st Senatorial District, and transacting such other business as might come before it.

Red Cloud, Sept. 9th A. D. 1876. Convention called to order by E. O. Parker.

On motion of G. D. Fullmer, J. R. Wilcox of Red Cloud was elected temporary chairman.

On motion of W. W. Fitzpatrick of Thayer Co. G. W. Fullmer was elected temporary secretary.

On motion the chair appointed a committee of three on credentials as follows: Jos. Garber, of Nuckolls; W. W. Fitzpatrick, of Thayer, and H. G. Bill, of Webster Co. The committee on credentials reported a majority and a minority report. The majority report recommended the following men as delegates, viz.: Thayer, C. B. Con, G. C. Briscoe, and W. W. Fitzpatrick by proxy; Nuckolls, Jos. Garber and G. D. Fullmer; Webster, H. G. Bill, A. Garber, J. R. Wilcox and Mark H. Warner, by proxy; Adams, contested, two and one half from each delegation viz., of the delegation headed by Darling, S. Darling, Wm. B. Thorpe and B. F. Munson by proxy, of the delegation headed by Ratcliffe, J. R. Ratcliffe, O. Whitson, and C. N. Morris; recommended that the chairman of each delegation cast the half vote. Signed by Jos. Garber and H. G. Bill.

Minority report recommended that the full delegation headed by Ratcliffe be admitted, viz., J. R. Ratcliffe, O. Whitson, and C. N. Morris; recommended that the chairman of each delegation cast the half vote. Signed by G. D. Fullmer.

On motion the majority report was adopted by a vote of six to three.

On motion Jos. Garber was elected permanent chairman and J. Darling was elected permanent secretary.

Convention adjourned one hour for supper.

Convention convened and on motion proceeded to nominate a candidate for State Senator.

On motion of G. W. Fullmer of Nuckolls Co., J. S. Gorham was declared the unanimous nominee of the convention for State Senator from the 21st Senatorial District.

On motion J. A. Tullies of Webster, A. V. Cole of Adams, J. H. Case of Nuckolls, and F. J. Hunter shot of Thayer, were selected a Senatorial Central Committee for the said District.

On motion Convention adjourned. Jos. Garber, Chairman.
