Mr. Ep.—Dear sir, having a few leisure moments, and the evenings being long I will drop you a few lines from this part of the country.

Things are running along as usual in a prosperous condition, the farmers and neighbors are all happy at the results of their past six month's labor, some of them have commenced to hush their corn and the yield is very good. Corn will average from fifty to seventy five bushels to the acre, and is good, sound and well matured, although potatoes do not turn out so well as was expected, but are better than last year. The late rains have put the ground in good condition for plowing and the farmers are improving the opportunity in preparing their farms for early spring sowing by fall plowing. This is something every farmer should look well to, as early fall plowing is just the thing for small grain, the earlier and the deeper plowing the better crops of small grain may be expected. I have about 75 acres now ready for spring sowing and it is all well plowed. Average depth six inches. By close observation I find, that the farmers in this part of the country are doing a better "job" of farming than in former years and they see the results, as the yield is better and a better quality of grain is raised.
