TRACEDIGS OF MISTORY. BY REV. J. M. PRYOP.

Hieroals choings was not the written language of Egypt only but also of every country and nation whose scriptology cannot be traced back through the Greeks to the Syrians, . e. the Israelites, from Cadmus to Mores. Such was the written language of Artees, and is the present scriptology of one third of the human race. It seems that the hieroglyphic was the utmost stretch to which the up aided powers of man could go in the invention of written language which bespeaks its origin in its merely mechanical character and its limitation as an organ of thought, being, in its nature incapable of further unfoldment and improvment, and therefore of bodying forth the higher conceptions of the human mind; while the scriptology of which Moses received the rudiments from the Father of spirits on Mount Sinai,- which graven on stone tablets set forth the 19 commandments, - is organic in its nature and capable of indefinite development and expansion issamuch as its primary elements like the coustituent atoms ofmatter, are capable of a countless variety of disposition. As the first man had been taught the art of vocal speech by the process of classifying and naming the animals, so Moses, under the same Divine Pather learned, the principle of all written language during those 40 days and nights on the mount, - just time through the process of learning to distinguish the visible signs in which the law was written, and also to perceive their uses by means of diverse combinations -

Having found whence the primary elements of organic language were derived, let us now see the use that was made of them, or trace the process of linguistic development which took its rise from them. This consists of two departments, -- the evolution of languages in the history of two of the greatest nations of the world. Ist, the development in the human mind of a receptivity, for Divine aupernaturally communicated verities or conceptions through the formation of a language fitted for the conveyance of the same - of which the Israelitish nation was the chosen we claim.

And 2nd the opening and expanmon of the human mind for the adenission of the aforesaid ideas or verities through the oultus which in volved the formation of another language adapted to the purpose, which was the national life-work of ancient Grecia.

Let us begin with the former.

The nation of Israel was organized in the desert by Moses under a threefold law, 1st. The moral law, the standard of character for all finite intelligences, adapted in form to the nature and world condition of man, 2nd. The civil law designed to maintain social order among the people. and preserve them as a nation in a corporate isolated capacity from all the surrounding nations and their orrupting debasing influences.

3rd. Their religious law regulating their religious practices and usages forming a system of object-teaching by useans of pictorial representations the process of development under our consideration.

To explain this subject clearly and fully, we must premise, that human vecubulary or language is originally derived from the senses i. e. from the organs and objects of sense because our primary ideas are those of ma terial objects which the mind resieve through the medium of the senses, to which our primary vocabulary necesaarily corresponds being expressive of the exercises, organs and objects of the senses.


