NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that by virtue of authority in us vested by an act of the Legislature of the State of Nebraska, approved February 13, A. D. 1878, entitled "An act to enable Counties, Cities and Precincts to borrow money on their bonds or to issue Bonds to aid in the construction or completion of works of internal improvement in this State and to legalize bonds already issued for such purposes."

We the County Commissioners of Webster County in the State of Nebraska, do hereby order a general election to be held in and for said County of Webster on the fourth day of May, 1878 at the usual places appointed for holding elections in the different precincts in said county, for the purpose of voting on the following proposition: to wit: That the County Commissioners of the County of Webster in the State of Nebraska for the purpose of aiding in the construction of the Republican Valley Railroad from a point on the Burlington and Missouri River Railroad in Nebraska at or near Hastings in Adams County, to a point in the Republican Valley in Webster County Nebraska at or near Red Cloud, issue the bonds of said County to the amount of Forty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars.

Said bonds to bear date January 1st, 1878, and to be payable to the Republican Valley Railroad Company or bearer at the expiration of Fifteen years from the date thereof, and to bear interest at the rate of 8 per cent per annum, from and after the date thereof payable annually to bearer on interest coupons attached thereto and principal and interest of said bonds payable at the office of the Treasurer of said county of Webster.

Provided, 1st That the work of constructing the said road shall be begun by the 1st day of July 1878.

Provided, 2nd, That the said bonds shall not be delivered until said Railroad shall be completed and the cars running from a point at or near Hastings in Adams County, Nebraska, to a point in the Republican Valley, at or near Red Cloud, Nebraska.

Provided, 3rd, That the said road shall be completed as above stated and the cars running through said County of Webster, as above stated, by the 1st day of July, eighteen hundred and seventy nine.

Provided, 4th, That a station shall be established by the said railroad company at some point at or near the northern boundary of said county of Webster, and an additional station between that point and the station at or near Red Cloud in the Republican Valley.

Provided, 5th, Said bonds shall not be delivered to the said road unless it is the first line built from the northern boundary of the county into the Republican Valley.

Provided further that should said road be extended up the Republican Valley to the west line of said Webster County there be a fur her station established at or near the center of range twelve on the line of said road.

And shall the County Commissioners of said Webster County cause to be annually levied in addition to the usual and other Taxes an amount of Tax sufficient to pay the interest accruing annually on said Bonds, and after the expiration of seven and a half years from the date thereof an additional amount of Tax annually thereafter sufficient to pay an equal portion of the principal of the same until they are all paid and cancelled.

Provided that such taxes so to be levied shall not exceed the amount of Taxes authorized by law to be levied to aid in the construction of works of internal improvements in this state.

And provided that said Taxes to pay the principal of said Bonds shall in no year exceed ten per cent. of the principal of said Bonds.

Said vote on said proposition shall be taken by Ballot, and all persons voting in favor of said proposition shall have printed or written thereon the words:

"Shall the County Bonds of Webster County, Nebraska, be issued to the Republican Valley Railroad Company in accordance with the proposition submitted by the County Commissioners?"

Yes.

And all persons voting against said proposition shall have printed or written thereon the words:

"Shall the County Bonds of Webster County, Nebraska, be issued to the Republican Valley Railroad Company in accordance with the proposition submitted by the County Commissioners?"

No.
