

HEALTH STAYS FROM THE DEER.
 —North Platte is to have a new school house.
 —Frisco county has 2,256 children of school age.
 —A study had is changing hands in this county.
 —City had hunters from Pennsylvania landed at Lincoln on Friday.
 —The cheese factory a Helron is nearly ready for business.
 —These two stables lighting and heating in David City is one day ready.
 —The new school buildings are in the final stages of completion at Lincoln.
 —The month of July is being talked of by some business as a good day to do business.
 —Mr. R. Hendley, of Beaver City, has broken a pair of tame buffaloes to break to the yoke.
 —The first three moon keepers in this county have paid the \$1,000 license and have in that city.
 —It is feared the late frosts have killed the melon crop back a week or two, which is bad news to many.
 —The old store in the old court house in Florence Hill, Colfax county, was removed to Wilber.
 —Over \$4,000 was paid out in Nebraska City on Wednesday for cattle brought in from Cass county.
 —The E. & M. Company have commenced work on the new depot at Lincoln on 11th street, Beatrice.
 —At a recent meeting of the county commissioners of Clay county the tax on horses was raised from \$50 to \$60.
 —Arrangements are about consummated for extending the E. & M. R. R. from Wilber, Iowa to Brownville this fall.
 —It is believed that Wasping Water has been chosen by a small majority as the future county-seat of Cass county.
 —L. Hobbs, the architect and builder, has secured the contract for the erection of the post hospital at Sidney.
 —The wives of two farmers on Deer Creek, Sherman county, were caught in a prairie fire recently and badly injured.
 —Indians are beginning to frequent Wagon Point with loads of lumber from the reservation, for which they find a ready market.
 —Prairie chickens are so numerous this season that they are getting to be a nuisance and a curse to the farmers in some localities.
 —The land adjacent to Kearney is fast passing out of the hands of government and railroad and into the hands of settler.
 —Oregon now represents very creditably nearly all branches of trade with one or two unimportant exceptions—a steamship and a tailor.
 —An excursion party from South Dakota, Indiana, bought such a piece of land close to York last week, and returned for their families.
 —The Stanton county murderers, John and Otto Rutzmeyer, were found guilty of manslaughter, and sentenced to the penitentiary for ten years.
 —The foundation and frame work of the cheese factory, at Wagon Point, are up, and workmen are making the building to completion as fast as possible.
 —Mr. Robert Orr, of Dakota City, bought \$3,000 worth of cattle of the farmers in that vicinity, last week, and started them for the Indian agency.
 —St. Helena and other points on the Missouri side of the Missouri, above Sioux City, are shipping large quantities of grain and produce by steamboats to the latter place.
 —There has been more work done in Brownville during the past four months in the way of improving residence property than has been done before for over four years.
 —Work on the new steam mill at Williams is being pushed forward rapidly, and will be, when completed, one of the most substantial structures in Fillmore county.
 —The Columbus State bank has paid off the last of the \$10,000 bonds, by request of the county treasurer. The bonds were not due, but they were paid to save interest.
 —Wilky county has 743 inhabitants, and Wheeler county, north of Valley, and unorganized, but attached to Valley for judicial and revenue purposes, has a population of 331 inhabitants.
 —There are at present about 10,000 head of sheep in Dawson county. The shearing has commenced, and it is believed they will yield a larger average than last season, which was but seven and seven-eighths per head.
