GUIDE ROCK
 -Wm. Sawyer lives down on the
 bottom south of the village, and has
 one of the richest farms in the county.
 He is one of the best - the very best -
 who have paid in advance for their

 -J. B. Watts makes his home and
 residing place south of the river.
 Has a good farm but has been unable
 until the last year to cultivate it very
 extensively. He raised some good po-
 tatoes, to which we can testify, as they
