STOLEN STATE NEWS.

The state prison brigades number 201. Nebraska has six hundred and sixty three post offices.

Loop valley was the scene of prairie fires last week.

Winter wheat in Richardson county is looking remarkably well.

Nelson, Nuckolls county, expects to have a railroad by July 1st.

Clay Center has been designated as the county seat of clay county.

The hunters of Nebraska are happy, game and ducks are in abundance.

The numerous flocks of sheep on the Loop are said to have wintered well.

Mr. Preston, of Deuel is building a cheese factory on Silver Creek.

The R. & M. have made another reduction in rates on corn to Chicago.

A grist mill is to be erected this spring on the Loop, at Rockford.

The Little Blue coal prospecting company numbers thirty-five stock holders.

Eleven cars of stock were shipped from Grand Island to Denver last Saturday.

Bids are in order for the erection of a court house at Minden, Kearney county.

Grafton is receiving a good portion of the immigration to Fillmore county.

Fairmont buyers have paid out, since December 1st, upwards of \$0,000 for hogs.

More building will be done in Grand Island this year than in any previous one.

Agent Vora has contracted for 2,000 fruit trees for the Omaha Indian reservation.

A New York Times Report represents the business of the country as in a reviving condition.

More way freight was received at Ketter last month than any two months last year.

Superintendent Barret recently organized the sixty-second school district of Platte county.

It is estimated that Nebraska's population in 1880 will be over four times as large as in 1870.

In looking over the stock ranges in the country around Sidney, the herders find very few dead cattle.

Red Cloud and Spotted Tail's band of Indians are killing large numbers of cattle in the northern part of the state.

There is more silver in the soil of Nebraska than in all the mines of Kentucky, and a great deal easier to get out.

About twenty new buildings have been built in York already this season, and many more are now in course of construction.

Immigrants looking for land arrived at Columbus from New York, Indiana, Ohio, New Jersey, and Michigan.

There are reports that the Sioux Indians are stealing and killing a large number of cattle in the northwest, and selling the beef.

A man was run over by the cars, while on a bridge, near Plattsmouth a few days ago. He was a German on his way to Chicago.

An insane man, manacled and chained to his seat, was brought up from the Republican valley, the other morning, on the way to the Insane Hospital.

Hon. J. D. Jenkins of Fillmore county, says that fine wool sheep will pay 45 per cent on the investment in Nebraska. He has been in the business five years.

It is probable that work will commence on the new Trinity Cathedral at Omaha, soon. Nearly enough money to complete the building has already been secured.

The Lincoln Journal says that at least twice as many agricultural implements are on the market now, as were before brought there—in one season we suppose it means.

Washington county farmers who have fed cattle during the past winter and sold them, estimate that their corn realized them from thirty five to forty cents per bushel.

Harvard citizens have resolved to prosecute to the extent of the law any young or old men who are found decorating the suburbs by horse racing, running or jumping.

The daily average of Swedish immigration to Kearney is about thirty. It is expected that about five thousand will be added to Buffalo and adjoining counties before the first of April.

The course of empire is taking its way westward with such unanimity, that the man who gets a whole wood box to himself on any of the west-bound trains, travels like a bloated bondholder or grasping monopolist.

Of the 267 prisoners now confined in our state prison, 120 have their labor sub-contracted, 25 of which are stone-masons, 27 tailors, 25 shoemakers, 19 cigar-makers, and 19 work for the Lincoln city laundry.

The tax levy for State purposes for this year will be four mills, the same as for the past year; but for 1880 it is only two mills, making a reduction in this tax for the coming two years, of 25 per cent.
