THE STORM KING!

Last Tuesday evening this section wa visited by one of the most destructive wind and rain storms that ever passed over this country mineo its settlement by the whites. About seven o'clock a beavy black cloud rose in the porth-west and the wind increased to a gale, clouds of dust filled the air, people who were out sought shelter, and by 8 o'clock the storm in all its fury burst upon us, lasting about three quarters of an hour. A numbr of houses in Red Cloud were blown down and a number of persons injured.

The following is as complete a list as we are able to get, up to the time of going to press:

Henry Hart, hand badly burt, and otherwise injured, "Dutch" Frank, hurt in the side; Mother in law of P. C. Smith, supposed to be fatally injured; Mrs. Ricinson, badly burned by lamp exploding; Mr. and Mrs. Parsons, both severely injured; Wm. Bright, badly injured; Mrs. C. W. Springer and child slightly hurt Mother and father of J. S. Gilham both more or less bruised; Mr. Cooper, arm broken: F. C. Smith, arm badly injured;

Mrs. Gibbs , slightly hurt. -The following buildings were wholly or partially demolished: M. Springer's house demolished; CHIEF office shaken up, windows broken and a few hundred pounds of type badly "pied:" roof off Miner's residence; Sherer's house off foundation: Seamman's house off foundation; F.
